Thrive/ P.S.H.E

Our Thrive learning this term will follow our action plan which has been created with the next steps for our right-time learning in mind.

In PSHE, our module is 'Changes'. As part of this module, we will be learning about how both everyday and big changes can make us feel and strategies to cope with changes. This will support us with our transition to secondary school.

British Values

This term we will revisit the Rule of Law. We will develop our understanding of law and order through our crime and punishment topic. We will use our 'We are All Born Free' book to explore the human rights which link to the Rule of Law Value.

Key Texts / Literacy

Linking to our Crime and Punishment topic, we will be developing our writing skills by writing 'A Postcard from Prison' and a newspaper report which will focus on 'Guilty or Not Guilty?' Each of these texts is a different genre and will enable us to develop our ability to write for different purposes. We will continue to develop our Active Reading skills in our Book Talk sessions and reading lessons.

Art / Music / DT

In Music, we will be learning about advanced rhythms and using this to compose music.

Maths

This half-term, we will continue to develop our arithmetic skills and will be focussing on shape, position and direction.

Safeguarding

Our Safeguarding assemblies will focus on areas such as peer pressure, refugees, homelessness and extremism. We will also complete a variety of first-aid learning including: bites, allergies and asthma. We will also complete work towards our Sunsafe Award.

Humanities

In History, we will be learning about the theme of Crime and Punishment. We will undertake a range of enquiries which will focus on how crimes have changed, how they are investigated now and have been in the past and how the punishments have developed and changed throughout the ages. Key Skills

We will focus on living an environmentally friendly lifestyle by upcycling a variety of natural materials in our forest schools sessions.

Computing

We will focussing on 3D modelling. We will use Tinkercad software to create a 3D house.

Science

Our Science topic this term is Animals including humans. Throughout this topic, we will be learning about the circulatory system, including: naming the main parts and describing their functions; recognising the impact of diet and exercise on our bodies and exploring the work of medical pioneers such as Alexander Fleming and William Harvey.
