Uniform during winter months and jewellery

Children wearing school jumpers and school colour fleeces in classrooms is recommended.

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Supporting your child at home

<u>Seesaw</u>

We introduced Seesaw over the last two years and have been using it for children to complete work at home, as well as for children and parents to communicate between staff. Children use Seesaw during school sometimes to record work they are doing by photographing it, but can also annotate and make films or voice recordings. One thing which a lot of children enjoyed doing during periods of lockdowns, whilst parents were busy trying to juggle work and home schooling, was to record themselves reading out aloud. We have continued to promote this as we understand how busy life can be



sometimes and we still want to promote reading to help all children become fluent and enjoy reading. Children will be rewarded for reading at home whether to an adult or recording themselves on Seesaw.

Login details should be in your child's home school diary. Unfortunately, if you have more than one child using Seesaw it does not allow you to join accounts as some parents have asked and they need to login each time.



Times Tables Rockstars

Children should all have a login for TTRS in the back of their Home School Diary. They can access TTRS at anytime on any device including phones. Each week in assembly we celebrate through our Maths Ambassadors different winners based on how much children score, how long they spend working on their tables or which class together has scored the highest. This includes interclass challenges. By the summer term in year 4 children should know ALL of their times tables. We continue using TTRS throughout all of school as it is important children continue to use their tables knowledge regularly and answer accurately and with speed.

Reading

Children are rewarded in school for how much they read at home every week, and also throughout the term. This is shared in assembly each week through the reading ambassadors. In school children are tested using Accelerated Reader which gives them a 'ZPD' which is the number band they should choose books from. At the end of reading a book they test themselves using an iPad with 10 quick questions to check their understanding of what they have read. They should have an accelerated reader login in the back of their home school diary, however this only works during school hours.





Children also have access to Epic reading which they can again access during school time with a range of books to read online. Children who struggle to read can also listen to books being read to them. To access Epic Reading at home you would unfortunately need to set up your own account which there is a monthly charge for, although if your child is off ill / isolating they could access this if they are well enough to read and it is during normal school hours.
